Unit Title: Co-operative Enterprise Activity (SCQF level 4)

Unit summary and entry requirements: In this unit candidates will plan, organise and run a co-operative enterprise with limited teacher support.

Plan and arrange an enterprise activity which demonstrates the co-operative values and principles, with limited teacher support.

Performance Criteria: 2.1 The allocation of tasks for the enterprise activity is negotiated democratically and in accordance with the results of the initial assessment.	Evidence of allocation of tasks being carried out democratically. This may take the form of notes of discussions at meetings, teacher's written comments or observation checklists or video evidence.
2.2 Allocated tasks are planned and carried out ethically under limited supervision and to a standard agreed with the teacher.	Performance evidence for co-operative enterprise activity. Written, oral and/or video evidence which supports this enterprise activity.
