Learning Outcome 4: Investigate and report on a co-operative enterprise in your local area.

Performance Criteria 4.1:

Identify a co-operative enterprise in your local area. Classify it as 'consumer', 'producer' or 'worker'. Justify your answer.

Performance Criteria 4.2:

Specify the business sector in which it operates.

Performance Criteria 4.3:

Investigate and produce a report which clearly describes

- Why it was set up.
- Who its members are.
- The nature of its business.
- Its purpose.
- The scale of the operation.
- The benefits it offers to members.

Assessment Strategy

Students should choose a co-operative enterprise in their local area.

They should be encouraged to do research, to find pictures and to write up their findings in a case-study, presentation or investigation.

Evidence can be written and/or videoed but all should be retained for moderation purposes.

The student is required to:

- Identify a local co-operative enterprise.
- Explain why it was set up.
- Describe the nature of its business, its purpose and the benefits it offers to members.
- Specify what business sector it operates in.

The information required to achieve this learning outcome is similar to that required in learning outcome 3 (performance criteria 3.4), i.e. evidence of research undertaken and correct statements about **3** of the above.

It is perfectly acceptable for the student to use their learning outcome 4 case study as evidence for question 4 in the learning outcome 3 assessment, providing that it is the type of co-operative chosen in PC 3.3.

This assessment can be on-going and done over a number of lessons or weeks. However, you will find that a maximum of 8 hours should be sufficient to gather information, collate evidence, set out, design and finish off whatever the chosen format is.

The format of this assessment is similar to that of National 4 learning outcome 5. This should help with dual level teaching as the assessments can be completed for both levels at the same time.

As with the other assessments, if the student fails to achieve learning outcome 4 first time, two re-sit chances should be given to improve and re-do their case study.

The check-sheet should be used as an assessment tool and to aid formative assessment amongst the students.
